## FAQs by Parents of Grades 9 - 12

1. How do I help my child to choose the right career option after school?

Identifying the Aptitude, Personality and Interest (API) of the child is the key. His/ Her comfort in particular subjects at grade 9 and 10 level and further at grade $11 \& 12$ level shall help us understand his/her aptitude. Observing the child while being engaged in different activities will give us an insight about his/her personality. Activities which really interest him/her will show us his/her interest area. By aligning these three aspects, we can help him/her choose the right stream. You can also take help from the Guidance Counsellor. Get the child's API testing done using myBlueprint.

## 2. What are different Career options after Grade 10 ?

At Canadian Bilingual School, there are 2 streams available after Grade 10. The child can choose to take Science Group (Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics) or Business Group (Accounting, Business Fundamentals, Marketing, Business Management, Information Technology).
3. What are the different career options available after Grade 12?
a. For specific countries and university entry requirements, refer to Page 6 of this guide.
b. For Degrees in Science and Business streams, refer to Page 11 of this guide.
4. My Child is not good at Math, can he opt out of Math after Grade 10?

No, for all the degrees open to any stream, mathematics is required in grade 11 and 12. In grade 12, he can opt for the Mathematics of Data Management for the core level.
5. My Child has a very wavering mind. He/she comes up with a different choice every now and then. What should I do? OR
My child wants to take a particular stream after Grade 10 / 12 because all his friends are going in that stream. What should I do?

OR
I want my child to take up my profession, but am not sure if he/she will be able to do that?
Meet the Guidance Counselor and the Principal to understand and identify your child's academic levels in the subjects of the both stream and the career options possible to help him/her choose the right stream.
6. We want our child to join family business. Which course is most suitable for him/her?

The course which he/she has the best interest in is the most suitable course. Pushing the child in a degree program matching your family business may not be the right thing to do. Rather give him/her a course of his/her interest which will make the child smart. Subsequently, he/she will be in a position to take your business forward.

## College Fair Checklist for Grade 11 (Sept / Oct)

A college fair is a gathering of college representatives who are looking for the right students for their institutions. They're there to spread the word about their college to high school students - and they want to talk to you.
The checklist in the following page will help you get the most out of each fair.

## Before You Go

- Find out which colleges will be at the fair (a list may be posted on the fair's website) and write down the names of the ones you want to learn about.
- Make a list of any questions you have.
- Bring your list, a pen, paper and a bag to hold college brochures.
- Make sure the email address that you give out won't embarrass you - remember, college admission officers will see it.


## While You're There

- Get a map of the fair and plan a route that will take you to the booths of all the colleges on your list. If there is no map available, do a quick survey of the room to locate your colleges.
- Visit booths and ask college representatives questions. For example, you can ask, "What kind of student are you looking for?" or "What makes your campus special?"
- Take a minute to jot down any information you think is important before moving on to the next booth.
- Check out some of the other booths when you're done with the colleges on your list. You may stumble onto a great college you hadn't considered.
- Attend an information session, if any are offered. Typical topics include applications and financial aid. These sessions are good opportunities to get expert advice.


## When You Get Home

- Ask yourself which colleges stood out and why.
- Organize the college material you collected and review it that week while it's fresh in your mind.
- Go over any notes you took during the fair.
- Throw out the pamphlets of colleges you've ruled out so you can focus on the colleges you're interested in.
- Do more research on the colleges you're thinking about. Explore websites, contact the admission office or plan a campus visit. If you liked what you saw at the fair, it may be time to see the college in person.

## Standardized Admission Tests

Students are expected to take their IELTS or TOEFL tests before applying to any university local or internationally. Students applying to American universities require the SAT test. All standardized tests can be taken from October of Grade 11. The final deadline is May of Grade 12.

- TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language)

US:

- SAT (Scholastic Admission Test)
- ACT (American College Testing)

UK:

- Academic IELTS for UKVI (UK govt. approved Secure English Language Test (SELT) - same as IELTS)

- BMAT (Bio Medical Admissions Test)

The scores required for admission to each university in each country is different. Generally, a good score across these tests is:

- IELTS - 7.5 (international), 5(Kuwait)
- TOEFL - 90 (iBT), 213 (CBT), 550 (PBT)
- SAT - 1500

## Important Note:

For those grades not completed at CBS between Gr $9-11$, the Ministry of Private Education will collate the marks of all transcripts of Gr $9-12$ (including CBS transcript) and calculate the total percentage after equivalization.

## Equivalency Process (for Kuwaiti students ONLY)

## End of January:

Students are expected to submit the following documents to the school guidance counselor, latest by the $25^{\text {th }}$ of January.

- Student Civil ID copy
- Father's civil ID copy
- Student pp copy - $1^{\text {st }}$ page - scanned in color
- Transcripts of Gr 9-11 (ONLY if studied in another school in these grades)


## End of May:

The afore mentioned documents along with the following will be submitted to the Ministry of Private Education by the school in June.

- Undertaking Form (filled by student in template provided by MoE)
- Wish list (checklist of universities the student wishes to attend - template provided by MoE)
- Transcript of four years (Gr 9-12)
- Graduation Diploma
- Sequence letter indicating the number of years student has studied at CBS
- Code of Conduct letter


## After Grade 12 Exams:

Once the equivalency process is complete, the student is given the following documents for postsecondary admissions from the high school office on a scheduled date within 8 working days after exams:

- Student File from PR
- Equivalized Graduation Diploma
- Equivalized Transcript of Gr 9-12
- Code of conduct letter
- Sequence letter
- Math Course Explanation letter (for students applying to Science streams)
- MoE Equivalency File No. with letter for every university that the student selected in the wish list.

## Kuwait Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE) Scholarship Program - Guidelines for Online Registration (only for Kuwaitis)

## I: Condition of IELTS or TOEFL:

1- IELTS Academic test with at least a score of (5) or TOEFL with at least a score of (45) within one year from the date of admission and before joining the scholarship.
2- After joining the scholarship, students are granted one calendar year from the date of starting to study the language to achieve the IELTS or TOEFL score required by universities.

## II: Registration in MOHE Scholarship Program:

1. Registration starts in June from $2^{\text {nd }}$ Saturday through Tuesday 12:00 pm.
2. Registration is made only via MOHE website www.mohe.edu.kw.
3. Applicants must be Kuwait citizens.
4. Applicants must be at least 17 years old and not more than 23 years old.
5. Admission will be announced via SMS and MOHE website.
6. Students who have already been admitted into an internal scholarship and withdrew before joining it are eligible to apply to the MOHE Scholarship Program.
7. Students who are not eligible to apply to MOHE scholarship program are those who have been admitted to:
a. Kuwait University,
b. private universities or
c. any other scholarship program outside Kuwait.
8. General certificates of secondary education must be equalized within 60 days from the date of admission, otherwise the scholarship will be cancelled.
9. Applicants must be aware of the majors listed in the Scholarship Program along with their scientific names in addition to being aware of admission requirements of universities for each major.
10. Applicants who desire to apply for medical field need to read carefully conditions of medical specialties.
11. Application will be cancelled if applicant fails to fulfill all the required documents stated on MOHE website before deadline of registration.
12. Any application to any specialization not listed in the MOHE Scholarship Program will be eliminated.

## III: Special procedures after declaring the names of students admitted/accepted in the ministry's scholarship program:

1. The Ministry will determine dates for the students admitted to the scholarship plan after announcing the results of admission. Students have to comply with the dates. The electronic system "Dayrah" will not allow any student to complete the procedures before the scheduled date.
2. The student's legal guardian must be present to sign the special undertaking on the scheduled date at the Ministry. As for those mothers who are custodians for their children, they must obtain a ruling from the competent court in respect to the educational custody outside Kuwait.

## IV: Documents for Registration (scanned copy):

1. From school (all docs. stamped by Ministry of Pvt. Education):
a. General Secondary School Transcript
b. Sequence letter of academic years for all secondary grades according to each Curriculum.
c. Academic conduct letter
2. From Private Education Administration at MOE
a. "To Who It May Concern" letter in respect to the equivalency of The General Certificate of Secondary Education
3. From student:
a. Civil ID copy of student and parent.
b. Passport copy (page with photo and details)
c. 4 passport sized photos of student
d. IELTS or TOEFL test result.

## V: Instructions for Online Registration:

1. Login to http://www.mohe.edu.kw/eRegistration/Login.aspx
2. Create new username for first login.
3. Enter name of student in both Arabic and English according to the passport.
4. Add student's mobile number and email
5. Select the options as per the requirements for each major in each country.
6. Add the required documents in PDF format ( file size must not exceed 900 KB and scanned documents must be clear and readable).
7. Finally, select "proceed" to send the application.
8. After completing registration process, the student can change his/her course options until 12 pm on the last day of registration.
9. Students may cancel the registration application through the system before the registration period ends without the need for a review by the Ministry.
When an SMS is received by the student to complete the missing information, it must be completed within 24 hours to avoid cancellation from the system.
To get application status updates, the student must follow up his personal account through the system.

## VI: Withdrawal from the Scholarship after declaring the admission results:

If a student desires to withdraw from the scholarship after declaring the admission results from the scholarship program, he/she has to follow the following steps:

1. Login to Deyrah system.
2. Select a new application.
3. Select withdrawal from the scholarship
4. Pay a withdrawal fees in amount of (KD.150) online by clicking "Pay" button.

## VII: Transcript - Course Requirements:

1. The general certificate of secondary education certificate for 4 years.
2. Transcript requirements:
a. At least 8 academic courses -2 science courses
b. 2 of these courses should be taken in Gr 12. The Gr 10-12 courses taken in a period exceeding thirty-six months will not be considered.
c. The student shall be classified as a secondary school graduate from the science section if he/she passes the following courses: Physics - Chemistry - Biology - Calculus or Pre-Calculus, Algebra 2
d. The student is classified as a graduate from the literary section if any of the aforesaid scientific courses is not available.
e. The Ministry of Education's courses - Arabic, Islamic Studies and Holy Quran will not be counted.
f. Non-academic courses: Music, Physical Education, Art, etc. are not accounted.
3. If the subject name of science / math subject is different, but confirms its content in respect to any of the above-mentioned subjects, it is mandatory to submit a letter from the school showing its equivalency for the subject.
4. Percentage calculation:

Total Percentage $=($ Total marks for Gr 9-12 completed at CBS $) /$ No. of credits
Students exceeding expectations across all 4 grades may get above 100 when calculating percentage. This mark adds weightage for scholarship selection, as the top certain \% of students are selected 5. Cumulative GPA calculation: (any percentage higher than 100 is taken as a 100 for conversion)
