EDITOR'S Note

WRITING MATTERS

Writing can be both a solitary and group activity. In many of our classrooms, the brainstorming of ideas is done as a collective activity with everyone contributing to the process. However, once the brainstorming phase is completed, most writing is usually a solitary task. The brainstorming process is a critical part of the writing process as research shows that the time spent generating possibilities adds creativity, originality and detail to the finished product.



At CBS, not only are we engaging students in brainstorming ideas, we are also including a second step to this process. First, and foremost, we are looking at taking the ideas generated and solidifying a plan before beginning a draft. This part of the process involves choosing relevant ideas and expanding them by adding details and determining the order in which they will be used in the writing. This planning phase allows the students to think more deeply about the organization and structure of their writing. It also helps with the flow of ideas and the development of supporting details. Once the plan is in place, students are encouraged to 'talk-through' their plan with a partner or small group. Vocalizing one's ideas and soliciting feedback from peers can help a writer to 'see' their writing through another lens and clarify the validity of their thinking.

Once this valuable part of the process is completed, our students are better equipped to write as the piece has been organized both in their mind and on paper. When students begin their draft, the ideas flow more rapidly and students tend to have more confidence in their ability to successfully complete the task.

The depth to which students engage in the pre-writing process is inherent upon the complexity of the writing assignment. By teaching students how to brainstorm and plan their writing before drafting, we are giving them the tools to become success writers.
