WRITING MATTERS

As we continue to move forward with our writing initiative, we are placing a greater emphasis on the 'What' of writing or more simply, the craft of writing. Specifically, it makes reference to using figurative devices such as metaphor, personification and simile to create detailed and creative images that make writing come alive. It also refers to organizing and developing ideas in new and inspiring ways.



As well, word choice and sentence fluency work hand-in-hand to elevate writing to a higher plane. When the above elements come together, the result is a piece of writing that exudes voice. In other words, the author leaves a piece of herself behind in her work.

The focus on the 'what' of writing is still a work in progress for us but hopefully this month's submissions will demonstrate the attempts our students are making to improve the 'what' in their writing. Specific craft lessons targeting the elements mentioned above are incorporated into the daily modelled writing lessons presented by our staff and are then practiced by the students during independent writing. Regular exposure to craft lessons and writing practice will enable our students to articulate their critical and creative thoughts in new and original ways. It will also enable them to reach greater heights in their writing.


All about Nurse




