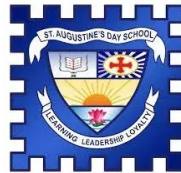
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International Collaboration

Exchange of ideas

A collaborative science exhibition between St Augustine's Day School, Barrackpore and Canadian Bilingual School, Kuwait is a virtual treat to both participants and audience. **Young Metro** reports...

As the nation celebrated the 73rd Republic Day on January 26, students of St Augustine's Day School, Barrackpore celebrated the occasion by hosting the first-ever science exhibition in collaboration with Canadian Bilingual School (CBS), Kuwait virtually.

The event's aim was to provide an exposure to the students to develop cultural understanding, knowledge and awareness of the wider world. It began with playing the national anthems of both the countries.

Principal Jhuma Biswas addressed the august audience by greeting a very good morning to Kuwait, good afternoon to the Indian audience and good evening to the staff members and students of the US.

The CBS participants displayed their exhibits, showcasing their scientific skills and creative thinking through self-designed working models. Eye-catching experiments on chromatography were presented using filter paper and water. The natural disaster of volcanic eruption was exhibited, with all safety precautions undertaken, using materials of daily necessities such as baking powder and vinegar. Seeing the live experiment of oxygen production was mind blowing. Using an aquatic plant

such as hydrilla, water and some light, this experiment was brought to life. Lucid explanations by the students made the presentations impressive. This was followed by the demonstrations of the students of St Augustine's Day School, Barrackpore.

While the younger students displayed the processes of inhalation and exhalation with balloons as lungs and a pipe as esophagus, their seniors demonstrated how lemons, being acidic, changed the dark black juice of China rose into reddish pink, and liquid detergent being a base changed the juice to a bluish green

colour. Some decided to add a touch of magic to their experiments by brewing their expertise with out-of-the-box thoughts. The exhibits of both the countries had multi-disciplinary sections, representing physics, chemistry and biology.

Chief guest Gihan Mohamed Hassan, who is the CBS principal, expressed appreciation for students of both the schools, saying: "The collaborative science exhibition is an important occasion for students of both the schools to share ideas and exchange thoughts. It also offers opportunities to showcase their scientific achievements which can motivate them to further their knowledge in scientific pursuits."

Guest of honour Mohona Mukherjee, principal of Multicultural Academy, Michigan, another collaborative school, said: "The success of a student starts with his or her present intentions, thinking of yesterday and dreams of tomorrow."

The "Exhibition of Togetherness" concluded with an aspiration of having more such collaborative activities in future, to widen the boundaries of sharing knowledge amongst students across continents.
