EDITOR'S NOTE




We know that good writers have a set of skills and behaviours that enhance their writing. Below is a list of skills and behaviours that we are modelling for, and teaching to, our students.


Good Writers ...


- Brainstorm and research their ideas before beginning to write

- Have a variety of organizational structures and patterns they can use to convey their message
- Write from what they know
- Vary the length, type, and complexity of their sentences to add interest
- Have an ever-expanding vocabulary and understanding of figurative devices to enhance their message
- Write with passion which brings out their voice
- Reread their writing to find ways to improve
- Read every day

As parents, you can support your child by posting this checklist and referring to it when you read your child's writing. As students, you should remember to use the checklists posted in your classrooms as they are a tool to help you become a better writer.






























Author Visit


