


SK GRADUATION

EDITOR'S Note

As many of you know, there are four main forms of writing: narrative, expository, descriptive and persuasive. They are designed to entertain, explain, describe and persuade. Within each form are many formats that can be explored. The Ontario Language and English curricula provide each grade with specific formats to ensure that students practice all four forms every year.



Each form and format has word choice, voice, sentence structure, organizational patterns, grammatical patterns, literary elements and content requirements designed to enhance the author's message. As we begin a new form/format of writing, teachers prepare success criteria to ensure that the students are aware of the required elements and to know what they will learn and need to demonstrate throughout the unit of study.

Along with explicit instruction and modelling, teachers provide feedback which is an essential part of nurturing student writers. As well, our student writers read and deconstruct samples of the format to familiarize themselves with the way it looks and sounds and in some case to enable them to write in the same style and voice. This is an excellent strategy to help writers get better at the craft of writing.

In this month's issue of CBS Express, we hope that our student writers describe for, entertain, inform or persuade you as you peruse their work. Happy reading!!!





Students were required to write a very short story and to incorporate the following words:

knocking, shadow, suddenly, toilet, Monday







Following our orders, we burned every document and escaped and I didn't see anyone on my team after that. I was so alone. I could only think of surviving and getting home to my wife and family.



When I arrived at the Japanese base I was surprised. Instead of attacking me in hopes of getting information they gave me food and a place to rest. At that time, I felt like I might be able to make it back home and I dreamed of going home to Marie and seeing my daughter.


