# EDITOR'S Note

Many of this month's writing samples are narratives as we have been preparing for our Young Author's Day celebration in the elementary school. As you can see, story writing with very beginning writers starts with pictures as they draw a simple beginning, middle and end.



Stories at this level may also be more of a retelling or a new take on a familiar story. Stories become more original as students become more familiar with the format and genres of narrative. As students become more proficient, character and setting play a greater role. An essential element of a narrative is the problem or conflict. Students begin with very simple problems that are easily solved. As they become more familiar with plot lines their stories contain a more fully developed middle and may include sub-plots.

Narrative is a very complex genre and many students struggle to create an original or creative piece. It is through instruction, practice and feedback that they become more comfortable and familiar writing this form. But more importantly, students need to read and listen to stories every day as reading helps to build their understanding of how stories work; how characters interact; how problems are solved; and how figurative devices enhance the writing. Reading a wide range of genres in the narrative form will help to spark imagination which will then be reflected in the personal narratives they create. Therefore, picture books, early chapter books and longer novels should become part of a student's daily reading diet.

### The little Fish



### PAST EVENTS - CANDY GRAM AND ORANGE DAY!






