EDITOR'S Note WRITING MATTERS





Since the late 15th century, illustrations have had a major impact on picture books and children's novels. Most early pictures were printed in black and white while a few pictures were coloured by hand. These books were considered luxury books and were only available to the rich as they were very costly. It wasn't until the 19th century that coloured printing became widely used. Along with the use of colour, the development of new methods to include illustrations opened doors for artists around the world.

Today, the illustrators of picture books are just as important as the writers as they need to capture the context and exemplify the writers' meaning. Their interpretations of the writers' words can make us laugh, get upset or even cry. For these reasons, many writers become very territorial about their chosen illustrator and often refuse to work with anyone else.

At CBS, we encourage our young writers to begin their story telling using pictures. As our student writers advance in their story telling abilities, we continue to include artistic expression using strategies such as story mapping, story boarding and comic strips. As well, our senior students have used the techniques found in graphic novels to illustrate scenes from Shakespearean plays and novels studied in class.

To paraphrase Fred R. Barnard, 'an illustration really is worth a thousand words'. We hope you will agree as you enjoy the creative illustrations that accompany many of the writing pieces in this month's edition of the Express. Happy reading!!









